

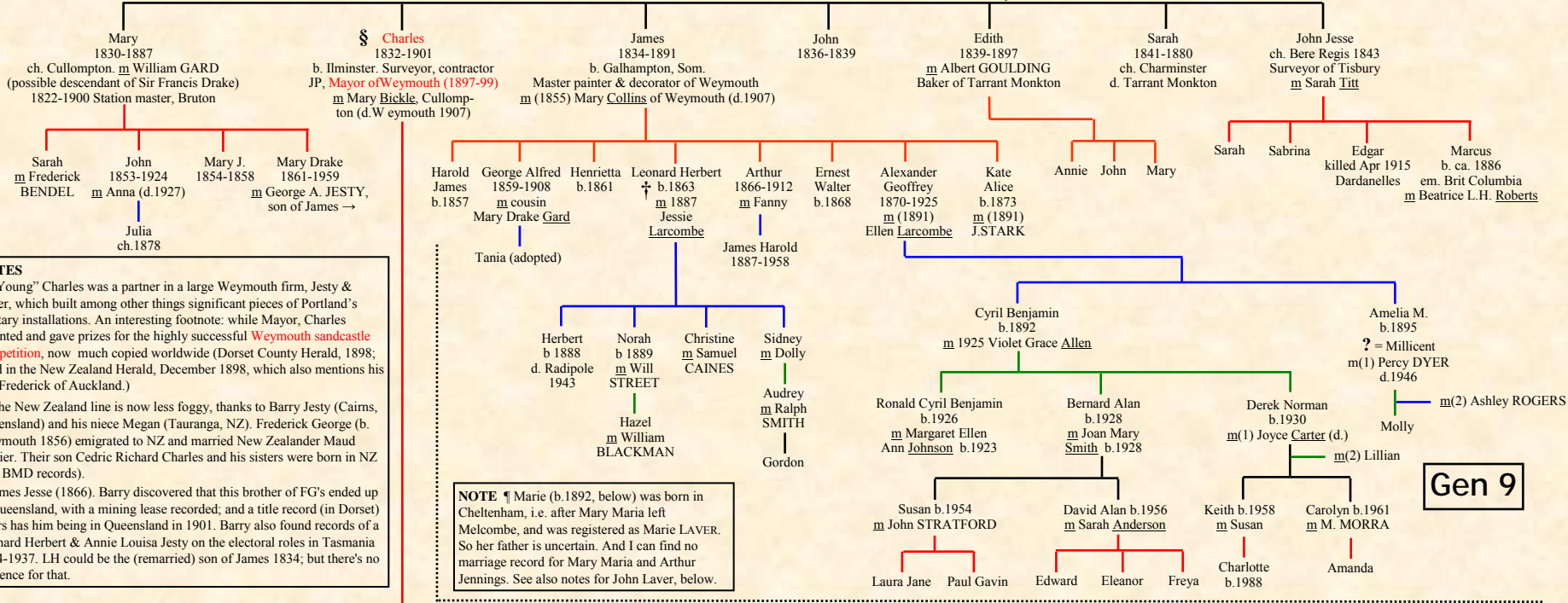

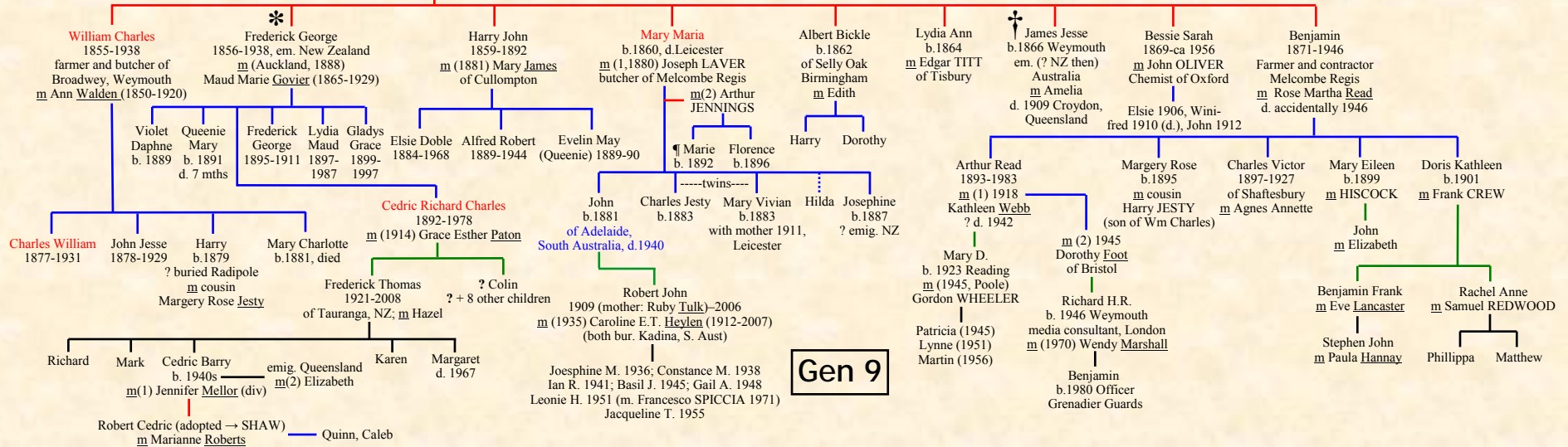

NOTES
§ "Young" Charles was a partner in a large Weymouth firm, Jesty & Baker, which built among other things significant pieces of Portland's military installations. An interesting footnote: while Mayor, Charles invented and gave prizes for the highly successful **Weymouth sandcastle competition**, now much copied worldwide (Dorset County Herald, 1898; cited in the New Zealand Herald, December 1898, which also mentions his son Frederick of Auckland).
* The New Zealand line is now less foggy, thanks to Barry Jesty (Cairns, Queensland) and his niece Megan (Tauranga, NZ). Frederick George (b. Weymouth 1856) emigrated to NZ and married New Zealander Maud Govier. Their son Cedric Richard Charles and his sisters were born in NZ (NZ BMD records).
† James Jesse (1866). Barry discovered that this brother of FG's ended up in Queensland, with a mining lease recorded; and a title record (in Dorset) refers has him being in Queensland in 1901. Barry also found records of a Leonard Herbert & Annie Louisa Jesty on the electoral roles in Tasmania 1914-1937. LH could be the (remarried) son of James 1834; but there's no evidence for that.

NOTE ¶ Marie (b.1892, below) was born in Cheltenham, i.e. after Mary Maria left Melcombe, and was registered as Marie LAVER. So her father is uncertain. And I can find no marriage record for Mary Maria and Arthur Jennings. See also notes for John Laver, below.
